Message du président

Chers collègues membres de l'Académie internationale d'histoire de la pharmacie

Je voudrais profiter de cette nouvelle édition de notre journal Communications pour vous rappeler tout d'abord que le 44^{ème} congrès international d'histoire de la pharmacie aura lieu dans un an, du 5 au 8 septembre 2019. Ce sera l'occasion de nous retrouver au cours de notre déjeuner habituel et de participer à la soirée organisée pour l'Académie internationale. Ce congrès a été organisé à Washington DC (USA), à l'occasion du bicentenaire de la Pharmacopée américaine (USP), sur le thème de la qualité. Ce fut en effet l'un des objectifs des pharmacopies de s'assurer de la qualité des matières premières et des médicaments mis à la disposition du corps médical et des patients. C'était un ouvrage de référence qui permettait aussi de fixer le contenu des formules, d'harmoniser la composition des médicaments sur un territoire donné ainsi que les poids ou volume utilisés, mais aussi de réaliser des médicaments à partir de la matière médicale indigène, utilisant les plantes de la région concernée. Je souhaite que de très nombreux membres de l'Académie internationale soit présents à ce Congrès et participent activement à faire connaître les moyens choisis dans leur pays respectif pour assurer la qualité des médicaments prescrits par les médecins au cours des siècles. Notre Académie internationale se doit en effet d'être toujours plus présente pour partager les connaissances de ses membres et donner des idées de nouvelles recherches pour les prochaines années. Le deuxième sujet que je souhaite aborder ici concerne les nouveaux membres de notre Académie. Pour l'instant, un seul nouveau membre a été proposé depuis le dernier congrès de Varsovie. Or nous savons que de nombreux pays, nous n'avons pas ou peu de membre de l'Académie. Dans certains grands pays comme le Japon, la Russie, l'Iran et bien d'autres nous n'avons soit pas de représentant, soit un ou deux seulement alors que nous pourrions en avoir beaucoup plus. Il ne faut donc pas hésiter à proposer des noms de personnalités intéressées par l'histoire de la pharmacie dans tous ces pays riches en histoire de la pharmacie mais où très peu d'historiens locaux se sont investis dans ce domaine. La publication du prochain numéro de Communications en avril 2019 est la dernière chance de proposer des candidats avant le prochain congrès à Washington. En effet, je vous rappelle que la démarche de nomination est la suivante : vous pouvez proposer une personnalité dont la candidature est proposée à l'ensemble de nos membres par le biais de notre journal, avec le soutien d'au moins deux académiciens actuels. Si aucun membre n'exprime son opposition à cette candidature, le nouveau membre est reçu lors du prochain congrès international au cours de la soirée consacrée à notre Académie.

Message from the president

Dear Colleagues, members of the International Academy of the History of Pharmacy


I would like to take the opportunity of this new issue of Communications to remind you first that the next International Congress for the History of Pharmacy will take place in one year from now, from 5th to 8th September 2019. This will be an opportunity to meet up during our traditional Academy members' lunch, and to participate in the Academy's ceremonial evening. This congress has been organized in Washington, DC (USA) at the time of the 200th anniversary of the US Pharmacopeia, on the topic of quality. It was indeed one of the objectives of pharmacopeias to ensure the quality of raw materials and drugs prepared for both health care professionals and patients. It was a reference document that was able to fix the content of medicinal products, to harmonise it for a given territory, and to require the use of the same units for volumes and weights. But a further role of pharmacopeias was to specify the local drugs to be used for the medicines in a given area. I hope that many members of the Academy will be present at this congress and will be actively part of it, presenting the means chosen over the centuries in their country to ensure the quality of drugs. Our Academy needs to be present to share the knowledge of our members and to present new ideas for future research. The second topic that I would like to share with you concerns the recruitment of new members for our Academy. At the present time, only one new member has been proposed since our last congress in Warsaw. Yet we know that numerous countries do not have any member. Some large countries such as Japan, Russia and Iran, as well as several others, have no representative or only one or two, although we could have many more according to our statutes. So, do not hesitate to propose the names of people interested and competent in the history of pharmacy in those countries where there is a rich history of pharmacy, but where very few historians are dedicated to this topic. The next issue of Communications in April 2019 will be the last opportunity to propose names before the Washington congress. I remind you about the nomination process: you can propose names of people that you consider appropriate, with the support of at least two members of the Academy. The candidate's CV is then published in our journal for consideration by the current members. If no negative comments are received, the candidate is approved and will be received during the next congress at the Acamedy evening.

I wish you a very good end of the year 2018, when we will commemorate the end of the First World War, and also offer (with some weeks still to go) my best wishes for 2019.



Professor Zbigniew Bela (1948-2018)



The Polish Members of the International Academy for the History of Pharmacy inform with deepest regret that Prof. Zbigniew Bela, Director of the Museum of Pharmacy in Cracow, died of heart disease at the age of 68 on September 6th 2018. His way to the history of pharmacy was long. After completing studies of the Polish language and literature in 1976, he worked as editor for a publishing house for 15 years. During this period of his life he wrote prose works and published them. One of them was even awarded.


In 1991 he became curator of the Museum of Pharmacy in Cracow. Three years later Zbigniew Bela obtained a postgraduate degree in museum science. He took his doctorate in 1998 on the basis of his Ph.D. thesis about the sixteenth century prescriptions for medicines by Alexius Pedemontanus. The dissertation was awarded by the Minister of National Education. In 2002 Dr. Leszek Ekiert, a member of the International Academy for the History of Pharmacy and Director of the Museum of Pharmacy in Cracow, passed away and then Zbigniew Bela took his post.

In 2006 Zbigniew took his post-doctoral qualifications on the basis of the monograph ‘Views on healing properties of gold from the ancient times to the present day’ for which he was awarded by the Minister of Science and Higher Education as well. In 2009 he became member of the International Academy for the History of Pharmacy and in 2015 was appointed professor. He gave lectures on the history of pharmacy and history of herbal medicine. His scientific achievements includes three books and more than fifty articles on the history of pharmacy. He was an expert in old pharmaceutical literature. Zbigniew is survived by his wife and son.

Doctor honoris causa William H. Helfand (1926-2018)

The American Institute of the History of Pharmacy is saddened to learn about the recent death of longtime AIHP member and past President William Hirsch Helfand. He died of heart failure on October 2 at Connecticut Hospice in Branford, Connecticut.

An avid collector of and an internationally recognized authority about the history of medical ephemera, Helfand first joined the Institute in 1953 and was a frequent attendee and contributor to AIHP events and activities.

Helfand served as AIHP President in 1965-66 and again from 1989-1991. He was the AIHP Second Vice President in 1963-64 and the AIHP Secretary in 1967-68. He was a member of the AIHP Council for

23 years between 1966 and 1993, and the Institute recognized his many years of service by appointing him AIHP Honorary President in 1993-94.

Over the years, Helfand authored or co-authored nearly 70 articles for "Pharmacy in History", including 51 installments of his popular "Historical Images of the Drug Market," which featured items from his unparalleled collection. He also wrote several books published by AIHP, including "Medicine & Pharmacy in American Political Prints" and "Potions Pills and Purges: The Art of Pharmacy".

AIHP fondly remembers William Helfand and his dedication to preserving and researching the history of pharmacy.

William H. Helfand was born on May 21, 1926 in Philadelphia, the eldest of three children. He received a degree in Chemical Engineering from the University of Pennsylvania in 1948, a degree in pharmacy from the Philadelphia College of Pharmacy and Science in 1952, and

honorary doctorates from the Philadelphia College of Pharmacy and Science and the Albany College of Pharmacy. In 1987, he retired after more than 33 years as an executive with Merck, the multinational pharmaceutical company, where he served as President of the French division from 1970 to 1974.

A longtime trustee to The Philadelphia Museum of Art and The Library Company of Philadelphia, he received numerous honors for his contributions to the history of medicine and pharmacy, including the 1972 Kremers Award and the 1989 Urdang Medal, both from the American Institute of the History of Pharmacy. In 1986, Helfand was awarded the Pepys Medal from the Ephemera Society in London for his outstanding contributions to the field of ephemera studies.

In 1997, with his wife Audrey, William Helfand endowed the Senior Curatorship of Prints and Drawings at Philadelphia Museum of Art. In subsequent years, he endowed research fellowships at the New York Academy of Medicine, the Library Company of Philadelphia, and the Grolier Club in New York, where he served as President from 2006 to 2010. A generous benefactor to a wide range of research institutions including The John Hay Whitney Medical Library at Yale, The David M. Rubenstein Rare Book and Manuscripts Library at Duke, The Huntington Library in Pasadena, and The New York Academy of Medicine, his voluminous collection included bookplates, caricatures, trade cards, valentines, sheet music, broadsides, prints, posters, and printed ephemera. Helfand spent his last years as an active advisor and friend to academics, historians, and collectors in the fields of medical and pharmaceutical history. Predeceased in 2002 by his wife, Audrey (Real) Helfand whom he married in 1954, he is survived by his daughters, Rachel and Jessica, and four grandchildren.

Dr. Michael Kessler-Oeri (1958–2018)

The Swiss members of the International Academy have the painful duty to announce the death of Dr. Michael Kessler. He was admitted to our institution at the Lucerne Congress in 2011.

Michael Kessler was born on 14 June 1958 in Basel. After studying pharmacy, he completed his doctorate at the University of Basel with a thesis on the psychotropic ingredients of the resin of *Boswellia sacra*. Even before completing his doctoral thesis, he was elected Director of the Basel Pharmacy Museum, one of the largest and richest of its kind in the world, where former members of the Academy such as Josef Anton Häfliger, Alfons Lutz and Lydia Mez-Mangold have been active. Michael Kessler put his many abilities at the service of the museum, such as his humour, his sensitivity and his ability as a good orator to arouse the enthusiasm of the audience. The latter also influenced his teaching activities at the University of Basel, where he has been teaching the history of pharmacy since 1992. Linked to tradition, he continued to develop the Basel Museum, without, however, making the charm he had inherited from its beginnings vanish: he wanted, as he said, a "real museum". Michael Kessler had strong ties to the cultural and social life of his native town, for example as an important personality in the saffron guild and as an enthusiastic participant in the carnival. His death on 10 August 2018 left a large gap in the small community of Swiss pharmacy history, but also in the numerous people who are committed to pharmaceutical museology throughout the world.

Titulaire d'un doctorat d'État en pharmacie (Université Paris Descartes) et d'un doctorat en études cinématographiques et audiovisuelles (Université Sorbonne Nouvelle), Thierry Lefebvre a exercé pendant une dizaine d'années en secteur hospitalier public, en particulier à l'hôpital Antoine Béclère, tout en menant en parallèle de nombreuses activités éditoriales et parfois radiophoniques. Maître de conférences en sciences de l'information et de la communication depuis 1997, il a été membre du Comité territorial de l'audiovisuel de Paris Île-de-France (Conseil supérieur de l'audiovisuel) de 2005 à 2017, et directeur, depuis près d'une vingtaine d'années, de la *Revue d'histoire de la pharmacie*.

Il est l'auteur de plusieurs centaines d'articles et notes, ainsi que de plusieurs ouvrages dont on trouvera la liste détaillée ci-après. Il collabore régulièrement avec la Cinémathèque française, l'Institut national de l'audiovisuel, le réseau Canopé, le Centre national de la cinématographie, etc.

La Société d'histoire de la pharmacie a organisé plusieurs séances au cours du 1^o semestre 2018.
